Invasive Plant Science and Management focuses on fundamental and applied research on invasive plant biology, ecology, management, and restoration of invaded non-crop areas, as well as on educational, sociopolitical, and technological aspects of invasive plant management.

Articles on the following topics are being solicited: • the biology and ecology of invasive plants in rangeland, parkland, prairie, pasture, preserve, urban, wildland, forestry, riparian, wetland, aquatic, recreational, rights-of-way, and other non-crop settings; • genetics of invasive plants; • social, ecological, and economic impacts of invasive plants; • design, efficacy, and integration of control tools; • land restoration and rehabilitation; • effects of management on soil, air, water, and wildlife; • scholarship in education, extension, and outreach methods and resources; • technology and product reports; • mapping and remote sensing, inventory and monitoring; • technology transfer tools; and • regulatory issues.

Types of Articles

- ❖ **Research and Education** Original, data-rich articles concerning research, teaching, extension, industry, consulting, regulation, and equipment are encouraged. Research articles and nontraditional reports such as surveys and new educational programs from extension and teaching are also welcomed.
- ❖ **Case Studies** Case studies are original articles on topics that describe and document highly focused invasive plant management, restoration, or rapid-response projects. These typically describe completed projects or the progress of long-term projects.
- ❖ **Reviews** Concise articles that synthesize current information about a topic of interest will be considered. Authors should contact the editor to discuss the proposed article.
- ❖ **Symposium Papers** Proceedings of invasive plant-related symposia may be published. Consult the editor before submitting.
- ❖ **Notes and Commentary** Descriptions of new invasive plants found in the United States or Canada, new research methods or equipment, and some surveys may be published. Critical research that cannot be repeated may also appear as a Note. Commentaries cover topical issues related to invasive plant science and management and are understood to represent the opinion(s) of author(s), but also must include appropriate citations and references to published sources.

Manuscripts will be peer-reviewed for content and presentation by two or more anonymous reviewers and an Associate Editor. Final acceptance or rejection is the prerogative of the Editor.

Authors are asked to pay a portion of publication costs: \$60 per black-and-white page plus an additional processing charge of \$50/manuscript if none of the authors are WSSA members. Page charges will be waived for case studies and reviews. Other exceptions may be made; please contact the Editor before submitting an article.

Invasive Plant Science and Management will be published quarterly, beginning the first quarter of 2008. The journal will be available as a benefit of WSSA membership and also by individual subscription.
